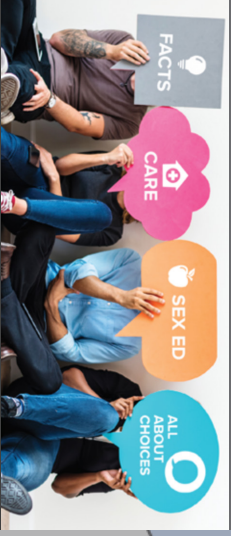


FEDERAL INVESTMENTS IN BURNABY NORTH – SEYMOUR, 2015 – 2024

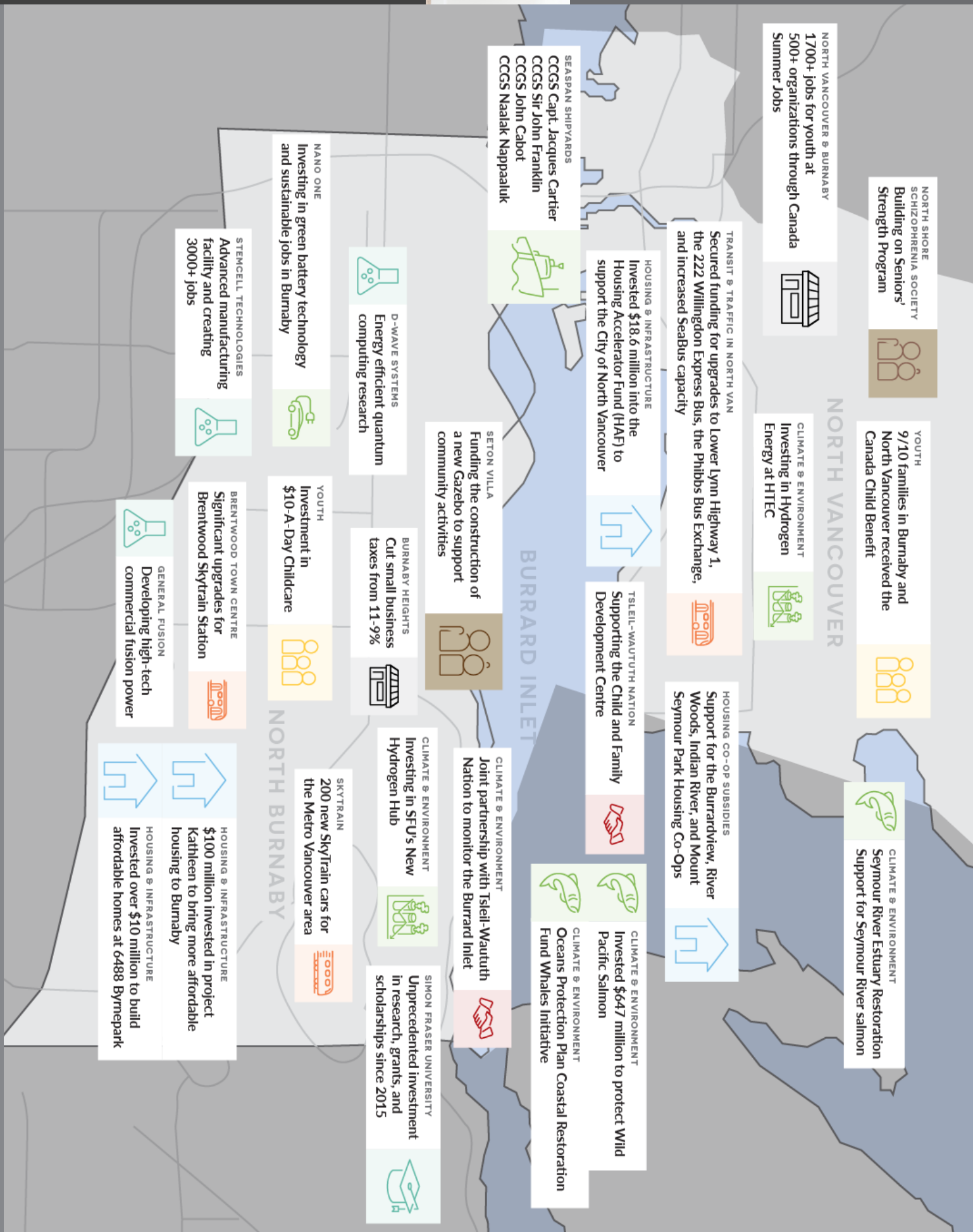

WORKING HARD FOR YOU

Dear Friends and Neighbours,

Since entering politics, I've focused on making life more affordable, improving healthcare, and tackling climate change while boosting our economy. As a G7 nation, Canada has the lowest deficit and debt-to-GDP ratio, setting a strong foundation for growth. However, our community still feels the strain, and I'm more determined than ever to address affordability.

This summer, our team knocked on almost every door in the riding to meet constituents and hear how we can better represent our community in the upcoming fall session of Parliament. This month's mailer highlights some of the main topics we heard on the doors.

AFFORDABILITY & FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Global inflation and increasing costs have been challenging for Burnaby and North Vancouver families. We've worked hard to reduce poverty levels and invest in our future, all while keeping our fiscal framework in check. While spending increased during the pandemic, Canada's debt-to-GDP ratio and debt servicing costs have declined. This is why we are the first nation to see interest rates and inflation decrease and what allows us to invest in programs that make life more affordable.

TRAFFIC & TRANSIT

Our investments in Skytrains, Seabus, electric buses, highways, bridges, and other infrastructure ensure our economy can grow while reducing your commute. We are also ensuring that the housing supply is increasing around transit hubs while also being streamlined, accessible, and cost-efficient.

HEALTH

In addition to our first health accord, we've committed a historic \$200 billion to ensure the provinces and territories have the resources to provide the quality health care we all deserve. Unlike previous agreements, this funding is tied to reporting on the use of the funds and health outcomes. Too often, money dedicated to health has been used for other purposes, but now, there is a mechanism to promote innovation, transparency, and best practices between the provinces and territories.

CLIMATE CHANGE & THE ENVIRONMENT

Governments have put off fighting climate change for too long, and now we must consolidate our efforts to catch up. You may have heard a misleading slogan that we need to "Axe the Tax." The federal carbon price is revenue-neutral and does not apply in BC. The federal program returns more money to 8 out of 10 families than they pay and works as an affordability program. This return disproportionately benefits low-income families. The cost of climate change is real, and we've worked hard to implement a world-leading plan that works while creating historic economic opportunities. Our plan is good for the planet, our community, and the economy, and we must continue implementing it with vigour.

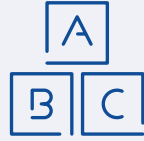

Housing Projects in Burnaby and North Vancouver

For over 30 years, the federal government had been absent from investing in housing. Today, individuals are moving into new affordable units every day nationwide. We have aligned our efforts with municipalities, provinces, and Indigenous nations to build supply. When we launched the National Housing Strategy, we knew we were taking on one of our country's most challenging economic and social problems. We must continue building infrastructure so everyone can access an affordable home.

BUILDING MORE MIXED-RATE AFFORDABLE HOMES AT EUNICE OH RESIDENCE

This three-story building provides 25 units of affordable rental housing. It features 3 studio apartments, 11 one-bedroom apartments, 8 two-bedroom apartments, and 3 three-bedroom apartments. The province, City of Burnaby, and Federal Government jointly funded this project.

STOPPING RENOVICATIONS AT TELFORD ON THE WALK

This six-storey building features 59 below-market and 7 market apartments and replaces an aging three-story building. This is the first building in Burnaby completed since the City of Burnaby introduced its Rental Use Zoning policy. This policy requires a 1-to-1 replacement of all rental units in multi-family buildings (with five or more units) lost through redevelopment. Displaced tenants are offered a unit in the new building with the same number of bedrooms and at the same rent they paid before redevelopment.

HELPING WOMEN AND THEIR DEPENDENTS AT YWCA MARION'S HOUSE

We invested \$40.7 million to build 32 homes, which will be operated by YMCA Metro Vancouver. The building will feature two- and three-bedroom apartments for women and their families who are living on low and moderate incomes. The site offers services onsite to help tenants access bursaries, employment opportunities and other supports for economic stability.

INCREASING THE SUPPLY OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING AT SITE 4 (904 LYTTON ST)

We invested \$40,300,00 through the Rapid Housing Initiative to build a six-storey building comprised of 33 below-market rental units, 56 market rental units and one commercial unit.
